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

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ABOVE THE LAW | BRYONY DUNNE

IRELAND



Every day at the break of dawn, a Cairo-based pigeon breeder named Hanan Badier unlatches the doors of his coop. By nightfall, the pigeons return since their basic needs are being met there. Should their survival necessitate migration one day, Hanan points out, "there's no law that determines where and when pigeons can fly; they don't have a law like humans do." As aerial footage of Cairo extends over the Mediterranean Sea, a refugee in Athens and an asylum seeker in Dublin each detail their escape from war to the shores of Europe. An animated map depicting the popular intercontinental routes of migratory birds is superimposed with the refugee trail, revealing parallel journeys across the same geographies. The aerial footage will be captured using "pigeon photography," which is a technique that was invented in 1907 by a German apothecary who fitted a pigeon with a miniature camera. In essence, this project will poetically unpack geopolitical restrictions (e.g. borders, citizenship, visas), encouraging audiences to compare and contrast the law of nature with the rule of man.

After a climate catastrophe half of the planet Earth has become unliveable. An ambitious young scientist Marcus (25) wants to do research in this area. He hires a former army pilot Valter (50) who takes him there. In an abandoned town they discover there is a big contradiction in what they know about what happened. Unfortunately there are survivors.



Kristo Jürmann (b. 1981 in Tallinn) has produced more than 20 short films, among them *Butterfly Man* (16', 2015) written by Urmas Nimetu and pitched at Euro Connection in 2014. He has been involved in coproduction with Finnish films like *Bodom* (85', 2016), *Ikitie*

(103', 2017) and awardwinning Mausoleum (26', 2016). He graduated from Baltic Film and Media School Master class as film producer in 2015.



Urmas Nimetu is an Estonian writer and director. His filmography includes more than 15 short films, among them award-winning No Fishing (3', 2008), Snatcher of Old Men (7', 2005) and Butterfly Man (16', 2015). Most of his films are taking place either in magic

realism, fairy tales or dreams. He is very into awakening such illusions on the screen, either by CGI, stop motion or clever editing tricks. **Urmas Nimetu** has studied journalism, television and cinematography.

YASHAR'S JOURNEY | SÉBASTIEN DE MONBRISON

FRANCE



SYNOPSIS

Yashar, a migrant from Iran trying to reach Paris by train from Italy, is desperately looking for a childhood friend he lost touch with after boarding a refugee boat. On the border between these two foreign lands, in these mountains inhabited by wolves hunted by fierce hunters, Yashar is pushed to his limits and must deal with his identity and the choice he has made to seek freedom.



Annabelle Bouzom worked initially on international migrant-related issues in France, Africa, and Asia. Her experience as a project director in the social and humanitarian sectors combined with her desire to accompany cinematographic writing processes

led her to create this production company. She develops short and feature fiction films, all while collaborating with other production companies as a junior producer and production manager. In 2014-2015, she participated in the Atelier Ludwigsburg-Paris at la Fémis film school. In 2017, she started giving classes to students in the Master of Production program at the ESAV film school, in Toulouse.



Born to a French father and an Egyptian mother, **Sébastien de Monbrison** studied anthropology and filmed audiovisual works on possession rites. In 2005, he codirected a documentary on postwar Bosnia-Herzegovina, then worked in the theater as a play

director and sometimes as an actor. In 2014, he directed, with Pierre Alfred Eberhard, the short film, I play squash (6') awarded in several festivals. **Sébastien** is currently working on directing the short film, Yashar's Journey as well as a documentary on voodoo in urban Africa. Since 2017, he has been an associate producer at the company, Le Bureau des Curiosités.

THE MAN IN TWO MINDS | MATHIAS BROE

DENMARK



Three young men take on a survival trip into a mystical forest. During their journey, they open up about their experiences of being attracted to both women and men – and the conflicts it has brought to their life and identity. Being temporarily liberated from social norms, they seek a deeper understanding of themselves as men beyond the stereotypical alpha male. The Man in Two Minds is a poetic and documentarian examination of the urges that drive us to choose how we live our lives, as much as a story about masculine sexuality and identity that urgently needs to be told.



Born and raised in a highly creative and entrepreneurial family in Hamburg, **Maximilian Mayrshofer** comes a long way to understand the power of film, especially as a social tool, essentially shaping our culture. It is this very potential – and the

people working with it – that drives him as a filmmaker. After spending his last two years of high school on an Irish boarding school, he was trained in commercial shipping, spent a year working with startups in Namibia and studied Economics, Politics and Philosophy in Copenhagen and Paris. Since graduating from that in 2014, he has produced more than five short films through his 73collective and been involved with feature film projects, VR and commercial video graduating from the alternative film school Super16 in 2018.

This short animated documentary gives an insight into how young fathers try to communicate with their unborn children. The film is based on recordings, in which fathers talk honestly about the urge to have a connection to the unborn child. As the visual contact to the baby is not possible, the best choice to get connected is everything audible. As there is a man just hollering towards the womb, there are even more men who will arm themselves with a guitar or with carefully picked records and Spotify playlists.



Patrik Sigmundt (b. 1981) is a Bachelor of Arts (Arts Academy, Turku, 2008). He has been working in the film industry since 2007 for Kaiho Republic, Edith Film and Franck Media. For these companies he has worked as a producer in animated short films, animated

tv-series and live action children tv-series with such directors as Kaisa Penttilä, Leena Jääskeläinen, Jan Andersson, Mika Purola and Laura Joutsi. His work experience also includes working as a production coordinator on several feature films, documentaries and TV programmes with directors such as Aku Louhimies, Hendrik Handloegten, Peter Greenaway and Simo Halinen.



Juho Luukkainen has been working with many different audiovisual platforms in various positions since 2008. His most notable work includes sound design from Opel advertisements to Adel Abidins installation art, all the way from being a Foley-artist for

WHOSE DAUGHTER ARE YOU? | ASTRID AAKRA

NORWAY



This animated short portrays the childhood of director Astrid Aakra together with her mother in a village on the west coast of Norway. Her father died early, and the mother and daughter struggle to fit in. They become ostracized, and this puts a heavy mark on their relationship. It evolves to a troublesome mix of contempt, shame, loyalty and love. Told in a humorous, yet sensitive style with an aim to understand, the director confronts herself, her mother and the narrow-minded environment that affected them so deeply.



Turid Rogne (b.1976) has studied documentary filmmaking and TV journalism at Volda University College, Norway and has produced and directed a number of documentaries and shorts, such as the animated short The Captain, the Pilot and the

Singer (7', 2014). She has also worked as a TV reporter and filmmaker at the Norwegian Broadcasting Corporation (NRK) for several years. In 2005 she was one of the founders of the production company Aldeles AS in Bergen, Norway, where she currently works as a producer and director in addition to collaborating with other production companies in Norway, such as **Big Spoon Animation AS**.

Big Spoon Animation AS was founded in 2016 and produces both animated documentaries and fiction. The company is owned and run by the experienced and award-winning director/animator Astrid Alma Aakra and is based in Oslo, Norway.



Astrid Alma Aakra (b.1960) is a Norwegian director, animator and illustrator. She studied art history, ethnology and political science at the University in Bergen before she started working as a journalist in Oslo. She then took an interest in film and TV and

made her first short in 1996. She worked as a freelancer at the Norwegian Broadcasting Corporation (NRK) during the 1990s, producing series and documentaries. She also worked as an illustrator for a variety of magazines. In 1999 her first animated short *Deep Shit* (6') premiered. She has directed two more animated shorts and worked as an animator/director on a wide range of projects for different studios in Oslo. Among her credits as an animator is the Oscar-winning short *The Danish Poet* (15', 2006).

David Doutel graduated in Sound and Image at the UCP School of Arts, with extensive training in Animation. For the last 10 years he has developed his work in the field of independent animation short films, both as director, animator and production director. Both in artistic

and production departments he has contributed to the creation of several award-winning short films that have been regularly selected to international film festivals. He has developed his career alongside with Vasco Sá with whom he shares the experience of direction on three short animated films, *The Shoemaker* (12′, 2011), *Fuligem* (14′, 2014, Clermont-Ferrand 2015) and their most recent *Augur*, a Portuguese/French co-production to be premiered in 2018. Has been working with **Bando à Parte** since 2011 and, together with Vasco Sá, has been responsible for the animation production direction and executive production.

BELGIUM



The sun shines fully and generously on a square brimming with people, enjoying its light and warmth to the fullest. The ultimate state of emergency has been declared. The last sun slowly subsides... What happens when space and time seemingly shrink? Dusk is a one-shot animated loop. It is a personal attempt to "landscape" our contemporary society cornered by scaremongery. The film is a social analysis of human (inter)action in the proverbial nightfall.



Frederik Nicolai (1977) started his career by executive producing short films (f.e. 2 shorts by his roots mate Michael R. Roskam), and worked on many fiction, documentary an animation projects in Belgium and the Netherlands. From 2006, Frederik produced

over 30 films, of which many are a cross-over between documentary, fiction and animation. Besides producer **Frederik** is also lector (Brussels university and DocNomads. eu) and directors coach for young filmmakers.





Walking the Dog is an independent animation company in Brussels created by Anton Roebben and Eric Goossens, focusing on artistically challenging animations. Today the portfolio contains a wide range of international

After their parents do not return from their trip abroad, three young siblings Egaline, Oskar and Amante pass the time exploring their countryside house. A game they devise out of boredom brings upon it a memory of their past and evokes different reactions from them. After teenagers try to break into their house, and a call from social services, Egaline decides they should drive away in search for their parents. A few moments later, another car turns up and parks in the driveway.



Starting out as a broadcast designer, **Martin Bonnići** has 10 years of experience in the audio-visual industries. He has trained under experts such as Laurence Moody, Bobette Buster and David Howard amongst others. Working in several departments has

allowed him to gain an understanding of various processes from animation to live-action production and in the past 6 years helped him produce and direct short films in a range of styles. His short film projects are among the most successful in Malta, having taken part in numerous festivals, markets and obtained various commercial distribution contracts. In 2010 **Martin** established and started running his own production company, **Shadeena**.



Stephanie Sant (b. 1992) graduated from Central Saint Martins in London with a Master's in Photography in 2016. Her practice involves filmmaking, photography, and her own body as a life model and performer, but writing has always been a foundation that

Iranian refugee Maryam and her mother end up in Afghanistan on their way to Europe. When her mom is killed by guerilla soldiers, Maryam is left to survive on her own. She dresses like a boy as a disguise, and unknowingly walks through a mine field when the conservative sheepherder and soldier Ahmed saves her life and takes her in. An unexpected friendship develops but Ahmed doesn't know Maryam's true identity, and Maryam learns that Ahmed had something to do with her mother's death



Malin Idevall has been working at Nordisk Film Production Sverige AB since 2013. She graduated in 2012 as a film producer from Stockholm University of the Arts.



Bahar Pars is an actor and director from Sweden. She was born in Shiraz, Iran, and came to Trelleborg, Sweden in 1989 with her family after the war between Iran and Iraq. Between 2003 and 2007 she studied acting at Teaterhögskolan in Stockholm. She

recently played the role of Parvaneh in the Oscar nominated feature A Man Called Ove. **Pars** has alongside her acting career directed several shorts, among others *Rinkebysvenska* (12', 2014), *Nyarsklockan koncept* (2015) and *Turkkisoken* (7', 2016).


